## M. J. Electric—Then and Now

In 1959, J. W. Reiten and Warren J. Brule partnered to become owners of M. J. Electric (MJE). In 1962, MJE became incorporated and was concentrating on residential, institutional, and commercial projects. During 1964, the business separated into two independent contractors when MJE transferred the residential and small commercial work to the Paul Electric Office.

The '70s and '80s saw the rise of the Industrial, Power and Controls Division and Utility Division. The Industrial, Power and Controls Division concentrated on key heavy-industrial projects in the mining, pulp and paper, and power plant markets whereas the Utility Division specialized in transmission/distribution lines, substations, and underground power and communications. To expand into the growing instrumentation and tubing market, MJE purchased Valley Electric Service, an established electrical contractor in Appleton, Wisconsin, and formed the Process Controls & Instrumentation (PCI) Division. MJE came full circle in 1992 by purchasing Paul Electric to once again perform commercial and residential construction through the Industrial, Power and Controls Division.

A major change occurred in December 2000 when MJE was sold and became part of InfraSource, Inc. On May 7, 2004 InfraSource was listed on the New York Stock Exchange (NYSE:IFS) resulting in MJE becoming a subsidiary of a publicly owned corporation. On January 1, 2007, M. J. Electric, Inc. changed to a limited liability company and is now known as M. J. Electric, LLC.

In the first quarter of 2007, MJE expanded their services to include a Program Management Organization (PMO) Division to provide construction management to customers for power delivery projects including lines, substations, and power plants. By functioning as a construction manager, it provides customers with preconstruction planning, subcontracting services, cost control, scheduling coordination, quality assurance, and safety relating to the prime electrical scope of work. This addition was part of MJE's continuing commitment to becoming a single source electrical contractor for our customers.

On August 30, 2007, Quanta Services, Inc. acquired InfraSource through an all stock merger. As a result of the merger, InfraSource became a wholly-owned subsidiary of Quanta. The acquisition with Quanta provides MJE with expanded resources including a skilled, mobile workforce of 16,000 employees, the largest equipment fleet in the industry, innovative technologies, and proprietary methodologies.

After 50 years MJE is still continuing to grow and develop into new markets. A joint venture formed by M. J. Electric, LLC and Balfour Beatty Infrastructure, Inc. called The New Energy Alliance (NEA) has signed a contract with National Grid to provide engineering and installation services in the New England region for the next five years.

As one of the nation's premier electrical contractors with offices in six states, our success is based on our resolute commitment to safety, professional competence, and customer satisfaction. This commitment is why MJE will continue to set the standard by which all others are measured.

## MJE's Evolution

As our customers' needs have evolved and grown over the years, MJE has diversified our business to remain the single source contractor they can rely on to fulfill those needs. M. J. Electric, LLC started as an industrial contractor and quickly moved into the utility market and continued on into engineering, control panel production (which became another arm of the company called Systems Control), process controls and instrumentation, and most recently we have added a Program Management Organization to provide project management services focused on customer requirements for project preplanning and total project construction administration.

As our company grew, there was an increased need to enlarge our footprint to support our nationwide pursuit of work and to provide a better response time to service our Utility Division clients. We now have established offices and equipment yards in: Chicago, Illinois, Detroit, Michigan, Shoemakersville, Pennsylvania, Green Bay, Wisconsin, Minneapolis, Minnesota and our latest Marlboro, Massachusetts.

The Industrial Division, based in the Iron Mountain Corporate Office, has performed work in most regions of the US with a larger presence in the Midwest States. At the beginning the Division's strength was in the booming mining and pulp and paper industries. Now environmental controls for power plants provides the majority of their business. These environmental projects are necessary upgrades due to the new environmental requirements in the industry.

The Utility Division is working on upgrading power grids for utilities across the nation. Increased energy demand has created a need for updating the current infrastructure to handle the increased load. Due to the multitude of projects the utilities need to complete, many utilities have developed alliance relationships with multi-year agreements to contractors in order to secure required resources and control costs of installations by resource leveling focused on project identification and preplanning. M. J. Electric, LLC is fortunate to have alliance agreements with American Transmission Company, ITCTransmission Company, Xcel Energy, Commonwealth Edison, and most recently with National Grid through the New Energy Alliance with our joint venture partner Balfour Beatty.

The Program Management Organization (PMO) was created in 2007 to help support internal needs in process and policy management focusing primarily in internal cost control, subcontract procurement, contract risk and continuous process improvements. The PMO established the model for program integration by blending the project management principles with MJE's in-house construction management to fulfill the external customer requirements for total program and portfolio management.

Trying to provide our customers with the best possible service has always been, and will continue to be, our focus. As the construction industry continues to expand and change, MJE is prepared to continue evolving to enhance the service to our customers.

## MJE Affiliations

M. J. Electric, LLC has been a proud member of the National Electrical Contractors Association for many of its 50 years. NECA has provided us with the tools and support to help us as a national contractor who works in multi-union jurisdictions. MJE has been active in the organization with employees serving on various committees, serving as Governors, and was a founding member of the Electric 21 Council. Our association with NECA has made us a better contractor and provided us an avenue for training and a voice in our industry. Thank you NECA for your assistance over our 50 years.

## National Recognition

Many M. J. Electric, LLC projects have been in major national publications over the years. Magazines such as *Transmission & Distribution World*, *Engineering News Record*, *Platts Power*, *Power Engineering*, *Power Magazine*, and *North American Wind Power* have highlighted projects that MJE has contributed to in both electrical and instrumentation work. Some of these projects were also presented with nationally recognized awards.

In 2004, *Power Engineering Magazine* listed the Silverhawk Power Plant as the 2004 Project of the Year. MJE's Process Controls and Instrumentation Division completed the instrumentation and control installation for the 570 MW Silverhawk Combined Cycle Generating Station in Las Vegas, NV.

In 2005, *Platts Power Magazine* listed the Magnolia Power Plant as the 2005 Plant of the Year. MJE completed the electrical installation for the new 310 MW Magnolia Plant in Burbank, California. The Magnolia Plant also earned the Golden Gate Partnership Recognition Award in 2005.

In 2008, *Power Magazine* listed Weston 4 as the Plant of the Year. MJE's Process Controls and Instrumentation Division completed the control and instrumentation construction for the new 500 MW coal-fired power plant. PCI also earned the OSHA Certificate of Commendation for their safety performance at Weston 4.

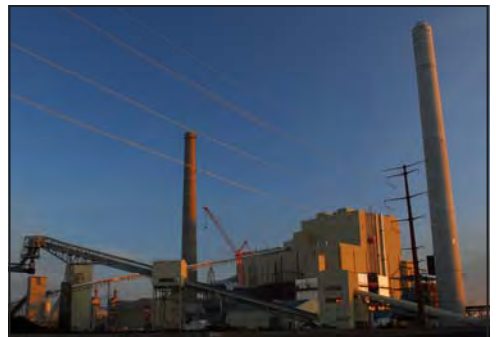
In 2009, The Edison Electric Institute, the association of publicly-owned electric companies, awarded the industry's highest honor, the Edison Award, for the 220-mile Arrowhead-Weston Transmission Line project. The Edison Award recognizes U.S. and international electric companies for outstanding leadership, innovation and advancement of the electric industry. The Arrowhead-Weston Transmission Line is one of the largest new extra high voltage transmission lines to be placed in service nationally in decades.

The only licensed operator of this proprietary equipment is Quanta Services, Inc. and allows M. J. Electric crews to separate live transmission and distribution power lines, up to and including 765 kV, from poles in order to efficiently repair, replace, or upgrade the infrastructure. The LineMaster™ Robotic Arm eliminates the need for power outages, costly line switching, or restrictive scheduling for maintenance or upgrade services.

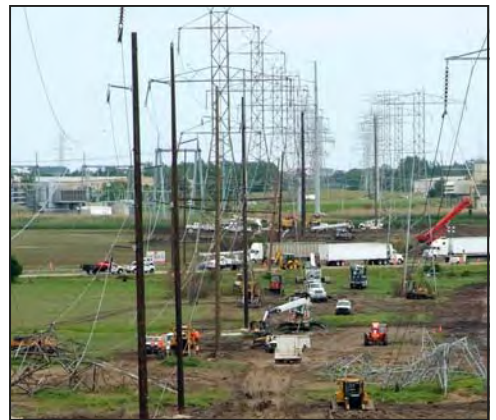

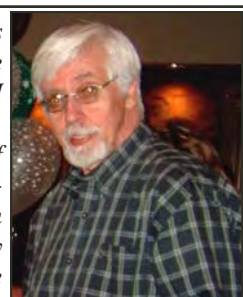
